DEAR PARENTS & CAREGIVERS...

We will keep our pool open for yet another week, though it will probably be the last as the cooler nights are certainly dropping the water temperature.

Some of the time spent swimming will now be focussed on other PE skill development. For most this will be developing skills needed for winter sports codes.

GUMBOOTS... we have noticed that a number of students are choosing to wear gumboots to school. We would really like to discourage this. Gumboots do not provide healthy support for growing feet and are not suitable for active play, kicking, running and the like as they are cumbersome. They also do not breathe and can cause quite an odour in learning spaces when they are removed after morning tea/ lunch.

Jaki and Rachael are very enthusiastic and motivated after attending recent professional learning in the teaching of reading. They are currently awaiting new reading books that take a different approach and preparing their programmes for change. It is always exciting to become familiar with recently researched approaches and adopting them in our learning programmes.

We remind you that the arrival time for students is about when the bus arrives at school 8.20am. Some parents have requested earlier drop offs with individual teachers due to work commitments however we are having children arrive before 8am and on some occasions when no staff are present. Before school preparation time is vital for teachers to set their learning programme for the day please respect this.

Kelvin our Resource Teacher of Learning and Behaviour (RTLB) has also trialled a new online programme to assist some of our senior writers. We are rapt that several of our students have now asked for this programme as they have found it supportive of their learning. It is exciting to have students take this responsibility and enthusiasm. We are currently investigating the cost of purchasing this programme, how could we not?

In a few weeks we are hosting a professional learning workshop for our Kāhui ako in mathematics. We have a highly regarded maths provider sharing his knowledge and resources. He will be working with some of our students through the day to demonstrate.

Easter is coming up and I want to remind you that Tuesday 6 April is not a school day. As Easter is mostly celebrated in the holidays now some are not aware of this and are caught out when Easter is during the term. Just a wee warning!

You will have received a comment regarding an aspect of your child's learning through the @school app. Teachers are currently sending another comment. You should have received at least three comments by the end of this term. Student led Conferences will take place on Wednesday 14 April the last week of this term.

Unfortunately, I will not be present for these upcoming Student-led Conferences as I have been selected to participate in the Leaders Partnership Programme. This will see me working part-time with the Education Review Office (ERO). In the last week of this Term I will train in Wellington and then until the end of term 1 2022 I will work alongside an experienced ERO evaluator undertaking reviews at various schools in a part-time capacity. This will be a fantastic Professional Learning Opportunity, however, my Upper Moutere Principal role will continue to be my priority.


