FROM THE PRINCIPAL ...

Dear Parents/Caregivers,

Term Two is done and dusted! At this week's Board meeting as we came to look at our next meeting date, we found we would be meeting in August! How does the year keep moving so quickly?

At the Board Meeting we welcomed Andy Marr to the School Board. With the resignation of Mel, the School Board sought to select a new member to replace her. Andy brings a long history with our school, school chaplain and youth worker, before training to be a teacher, being a dad of students at the school and more recently as Pastor of the Lutheran Church. Andy is well known in our community.

The term has seen our students participate in several sporting events and with some success. This year the ten 30 minute lessons with additional supervised free time in the pool and travel to and from the Aquatic Centre will be \$60 per student. We can and will help, we do not want this extra cost to add stress to anyone.

You will have received a notice from teachers regarding our health programme "Keeping Ourselves Safe". This programme will be our focus for learning in the first two weeks of next term. Police Education Officer Marcus will be working with us and is offering a parent information session at 3.30pm on Wednesday 28 July, first week back.

On the Thursday 29 July of the first week back our senior students will be involved in planting some of our 1500 plants grown at school as part of the Moutere Catchment work. We will be led by Simon Le Gros who has been contracted to undertake the planting area we will be working in on Neudorf Road. If you would like to join us, please let us know.
